While COVID-19 affects everyone, it is not equally so. Women and girls face unique challenges, such as the burden of caring for the sick and out-of-school children, higher risk of infection, and susceptibility to the economic impact of COVID-19. Research shows that women themselves are reporting more, deeper, and longer-lasting impacts from COVID-19 than men are, especially around livelihoods, food and access to services. Almost every country and context is reporting rises in gender based violence. Without accounting for the differing experiences of women, and especially women in BIPOC communities in the US, an effective response would not be possible. This pandemic is a global challenge, and our response must include efforts to safeguard vulnerable populations around the world. How do we ensure that women are not forgotten in relief efforts? Since the onset of COVID-19, over 350,000 child care workers in the U.S. have lost their jobs – a group predominated by women and, disproportionately, women of color. At the same time, child care is essential to working parents -- seven in ten mothers in the labor force depend on child care. As the country moves to reopen, the child care industry faces an impossible dilemma between reopening safely and providing child care to parents who need it most.

Back in March, the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act provided \$3.5 billion in additional discretionary funding for the federal Child Care and Development Block Grant (CCDBG), a program that provides funding to states to help low- and moderate-income families afford child care and to improve the quality of care. Following on from months of lackluster federal action, the National Women's Law Center released the "State Impacts and Responses Report" on the effectiveness of CCDBG funding, based on interviews with state representatives and local officials.
